I have a great passion for the history of metalsmithing. I use this research to create layers of meaning in my own work. By integrating historical quotations from diverse sources, I am able to leave the original context behind and engage in a personal dialog with the work.

Visual imagery combined with the permanence, value and purity of the materials are integral parts of my work. I have consistently sought to imbue each piece with a distilled and rarefied aura. This is jewelry that celebrates life. It exists beyond the constraints of politics or fashion, its immutability a testament to the human spirit.

Over the past few years I have been working with a series based on a common fourth century BC decorative motif known as the Heracles knot. The Heracles knot probably originated in ancient Egypt and remained popular through Roman times. These often-extraordinary representations of a simple tied knot had strong connections to the marriage ceremony. Ancient Greek wedding practices viewed the tying and untying of the bride's wedding garment as symbolic; the binding of two people together and the transition into matrimony. As a decorative motif it represented strength, love and fertility.

In my own work I became interested not in the idea of people bound together, but of intertwined lives. The formal knot was loosened. Love becomes a path taken, interactive but not restricting. Fertility is regarded as the natural outcome. It is both spiritual and material in nature. The pieces look at life as gardens of our own inventions. They twist and turn, bear strange fruits and flowers, and are hopefully beautiful!
